The Industrial Commission of Ohio Launches New Web Site

The new Ohioic.com will better serve our customers

COLUMBUS – The Industrial Commission of Ohio (IC) is accelerating our service to customers by launching the newly redesigned Ohioic.com. The new Web site features streamlined navigation, “Quick Links” for ease of use, improved accessibility, plus the latest IC news and events on our home page.

Making its first appearance on our home page is “Agency News”. Now, there’s no need to search through our site to find the most current news and events pertaining to the IC. We’ve also done our spring-cleaning and reorganized Ohioic.com to help you find information in a more orderly manner. Web site sections have been compressed and links have been streamlined to make navigation easier.

Our new “Quick Links” speed up access to the areas of our site that you visit most. With just a few clicks, you can logon to the Industrial Commission’s Online Network (I.C.O.N.), learn more about the IC, or visit one of our online manuals that have been updated to user and printer friendly PDFs.

In addition, our new and improved Web site is restructured to meet the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliance Guidelines as well as the State of Ohio Executive Branch Web Site Standardization Policy. The Web Site Standardization Policy requires cabinet-level state agencies to build sites that look similar to Ohio.gov, so that customers grow accustomed to using similar navigation tools when they visit state agency Web sites.

The IC conducts hearings on disputed workers’ compensation claims, determines violations of specific safety requirements, and determines if an injured worker is permanently and temporarily disabled due to a work-related injury or occupational disease.
